Faculty

According to the National Center for Education Statistics, in the fall of 2011, there were about 1.5 million instructional faculty in degree-granting postsecondary institutions. The faculty included professors, associate professors, assistant professors, instructors, lecturers, assisting professors, adjunct professors, or interim professors.

In the fall of 2011, of those full-time instructional faculty whose race/ethnicity was known, 79% were White, 6% were Black, 4% were Hispanic, 9% were Asian/Pacific Islander, and less than 1% were American Indian/Alaska Native or two or more races. Among full-time professors, 84% were White (60% were White males and 25% were White females), 4% were Black, 3% were Hispanic, 8% were Asian/Pacific Islander, and less than 1% were American Indian/Alaska Native. Among associate professors, 80% were White (46% were White males and 34% were White females), 6% were Black, 4% were Hispanic, and 10% were Asian/Pacific Islander (Kena, 2014).

Among the WPU faculty in 2014-2015, 76% were White, 7% were Black, and 17% were Hispanic. In comparison to the national statistics, WPU has a higher percentage of minority professors.
